A. A RESOLUTION SUMMARIZING EXPENDITURES AND REVENUES FOR EACH FUND AND ADOPTING A BUDGET FOR THE EAST BOULDER COUNTY WATER DISTRICT FOR THE CALENDER YEAR BEGINNING ON THE FIRST DAY OF JANUARY 2020 AND ENDING ON THE LAST DAY OF DECEMBER 2020.

WHEREAS, The District's Budget Officer submitted a proposed Budget to the Board of Directors on October 13, 2019, for its consideration, and;

WHEREAS, upon due and proper notice, published in accordance with the law, said proposed Budget was open for inspection by the public at a designated place, a public hearing was held on November 11, 2019 and interested taxpayers were given the opportunity to file or register any objections to said proposed Budget, and;

WHEREAS, whatever increases may have been made in the expenditures, like increases were added to the revenues so that the Budget remains in balance, as required by law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Board of Directors of East Boulder County Water District:

RESOLUTION TO SET MILL LEVIES

A RESOLUTION LEVYING GENERAL PROPERTY TAXES FOR THE YEAR 2019, TO HELP DEFRAY THE COST OF GOVERNMENT

FOR THE EAST BOULDER COUNTY WATER DISTRICT FOR THE 2020 BUDGET YEAR.

WHEREAS, on November 11, 2019 the Board of Directors of East Boulder County Water District has adopted the annual

budgets in accordance with the Local Government Budget Law;

WHEREAS, the amount of money necessary to balance the budget for general operating purposes from property tax revenue

is <u>\$ -0-</u>, and;

WHEREAS, the amount of money necessary to balance the budget for bonds and interest purposes from property tax revenue

is \$ 156,500, and;

WHEREAS, the 2019 valuation for assessment for the East Boulder County Water District, as certified by the Boulder County

Assessor, is \$14,399,090.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE EAST BOULDER COUNTY WATER DISTRICT:

Section 1. That for the purpose of meeting all water enterprise fund expenses of the District during the District's 2020 budget year, there is hereby levied a tax of _0_ mills upon each dollar of the total valuation for assessment of all taxable property

within the District for the previous year (2019).

Section 2. That for the purpose of meeting all bonds and interest of the District during the District's 2020 budget year, there is hereby levied a tax of 10.869 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation of assessment of all taxable property within the

District for the previous year (2019).

Section 3. That the District's Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to immediately certify to the County Commissioners of Boulder County, Colorado, the mill levies for the District hereinabove determined and set, and to execute such form or forms as may be required by the County Commissioners for such purposes; provided, however, that in the event that the final notice of assessed valuation will cause an adjustment to such mill levy in order to raise the amounts stated to balance the District's budget, the District's Budget Officer is authorized to make such adjustment based upon the final assessed valuations

received from the County Assessor. In no event shall such adjustments result in any unauthorized non-voter approved

increase in the mill levy.

BUDGET MESSAGE - 2020 BUDGET YEAR

Water Enterprise Fund:

East Boulder County Water District accounts for its financial operations as a proprietary fund. Assets, liabilities, revenues and expenses are recognized on the accrual basis. Under the accrual basis, revenues are recognized in the accounting period in which they become measurable; expenses are recognized in the period incurred, if measurable.

East Boulder County Water District was established in 2000 to provide water to homes in unincorporated Boulder County that had previously been served by private wells or community wells. The District now provides water service to 146 homes. The primary source of revenue is the sale of water. Pre-treated water is purchased from The City of Lafayette and distributed through District-owned lines and meters. Each customer is charged a monthly fee over and above their water usage, which is used to pay operating expenses. Water rates will increase 5% in 2020 as part of a long-range rate increase program passed on from our supplier. There is no property tax levy for operations.

The District contracts out the bookkeeping duties, meter reading, operations and maintenance. The only facilities owned by the District are a pump house and underground storage tanks.

No capital expenditures are planned for 2020. There is a small budget capital amount to cover unforeseen expenses.

BUDGET MESSAGE - 2020 BUDGET YEAR

Debt Service Fund:

East Boulder County Water District accounts for its financial operations as a proprietary fund. Assets, liabilities, revenues and expenses are recognized on the accrual basis. Under the accrual basis, revenues are recognized in the accounting period in which they become measurable; expenses are recognized in the period incurred, if measurable.

East Boulder County Water District has \$175,000 in outstanding General Obligation Bonds with interest rates from 2.5 % to 3.25% as of January 1, 2020. The bonds will be completely retired in 2020.

Bond Principal of \$175,000 will be retired on December 1, 2020. Interest payments totaling \$5,214 will be made on June 1, 2020 and December 1, 2020. Interest income of \$442, a transfer from reserves of \$25,392, and a mill levy of 10.869 on the assessed valuation of \$14,399,090 will be used to satisfy these Debt Service requirements.
